# MSA Guide to Fourth Grade

## <u>1. Grades:</u>

- Students will be graded in 4 categories for math, reading, and writing: Homework 10%, Classwork 20%, Quizzes 25%, Tests 45%.
- Students will be graded in 3 categories for science and social studies: Participation 15%, Assignments 35%, Tests 50%.
- \* Most tests are on Fridays, except for social studies and science.
- \* Students will receive all graded work for the week on Fridays.
- Grades for the week will be entered on Parent Portal on Fridays.
- Please check your child's progress regularly so there are no surprises!

# 2. Homework:

- Homework will be assigned and turned in weekly.
- Students will receive a Homework Packet Cover Sheet ("The CS") <u>each Monday</u> and due the following Monday.
- All homework should be done NEATLY on notebook paper and stapled behind the CS in order.
- The students will have 7 days to do 4 days of homework, so the due date is firm!! No exceptions!! They may return it early!
- Students should be working on homework independently, with parents checking it over and then signing the CS. (Only help children if they're stuck! Build independence!)

# 3. Forms, Money, Other:

Anytime you send a form, money, permission slip, box tops, etc. to school, please make sure it is in an envelope or baggie with your child's name and room number. (This is a favor to the office. Please help make their lives easier so they don't have to search to figure out who the money/form/etc. belongs to.)

# 4. Weekly Reading Log:

- ✤ The reading log is included on the CS.
- Students should read 4 times a week for at least 20 minutes and record it on the reading log.
- Students can read anything they like for this!

# 5. Spelling/Vocab:

- Students will receive spelling words each week, along with vocabulary words, which will all be found on the CS. The structure may vary throughout the year.
- There will be a spelling and vocab test each Friday.
- There will be at least one assignment in the Homework Packet for spelling/vocab each week.

#### <u>6. Speaking & Listening Grades:</u>

- Speaking and Listening will be scored bi-weekly using a rubric.
- Parents will initial the rubric when it comes home and send it back to school.
- These are SO hard to keep track of for the kids! There will be a consequence of a few minutes off choice time if they don't have it.

## 7. Recess, Choice Time & Toys:

- Recess will be outside each day, weather permitting. Make sure your child is dressed accordingly.
- Choice Time is a <u>privilege</u> that children <u>earn</u> all week, and will happen every Friday.
- Children may bring toys and games for recess and choice time at their own risk. Teachers are not responsible for lost, broken, or stolen items.
- Some fun school supplies (ex. Hamburger erasers, troll pencil tops, etc.) are too "toy like" for school and cause distractions. Please leave at home.
- If a child has a toy or game out *during class time*, the teacher will take it until the end of the school year. No exceptions.

#### 8. Parties, Celebrations & Snacks:

- Intermediate grades do not allow birthday parties in the classroom.
  Students may not bring treats for their birthday.
- Per CPS policy, "junk food" treats will be allowed only 2 days during the school year. For fourth grade, those days will be Halloween and the MSA School Picnic. There are no exceptions.
- Other holiday/celebration treats will adhere to the CPS Healthy Snack list.

# 9. Parking:

 Please be aware that the parking lot will be for staff only, due to limited spaces. Please plan accordingly.

- You can begin the process if you didn't last year by taking your license to the office.
- Level 2 Volunteers are needed for in school events and field trips where the class stays together. Level 1 Volunteers are needed for field trips where you will be in charge of a group.
